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WHAT IS CTE?

- CTE refers to programs of study offered mainly by secondary schools, regional technical centers, and community and technical colleges.
 - Focused on high wage, high skills, and in-demand occupations that require education and training beyond high school.
- Provides a wide variety of career exploration, skills development, and credentialing opportunities that reach a large share of secondary and postsecondary learners.
 - CTE, in one form or another, is estimated to reach more than 90% of high school graduates.






VISION FOR CTE



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
